The Easter Extravaganza!

Cheswick Green Residents Association ran its first Easter event in the village on Easter Sunday. There were craft stalls offering a range of items from wooden goods to exotic fruits. There was also an Easter egg hunt around the village and a duck race. The hunt proved a challenge for some, but helped update their local knowledge, seems very few of you know about the Mount or its history! The Duck race was a massive success with 179 ducks racing down Mount Brook which was streamed live to Facebook and saw the community standing on the banks egging their ducks on to win. The event raised over £600 for the RA, which will be used to finance other events later this year.

The nature reserve and the flower bed on the green

Our nature reserve is coming to life, last year Warwickshire Wildlife Trust helped to create the area and plant it with our 900 native plants. As the weather is warming up, these are now coming to life. We moved the bug hotel into the nature reserve earlier this year and although we'd have liked it to be on view in the middle, this proved to be tempting for the youths to take it apart and film themselves throwing it into the ponds (*well done lads, just so you know you are on CCTV!!*) As such it is now located closer to the fence near to the largest of the ponds. If you are accessing this area, please do so via the pedestrian gate and not over the fence or vehicle gate.

You may also have noticed, thanks for the emails and TOWIC posts, that we have commissioned some work to be undertaken on the Village Green. The flower bed at the bottom of the green had not been touched for years, it had lots of overgrown shrubs and weeds growing in it and limited diversity of wildlife. The bed has now been dug over, the older shrubs and weeds removed and it is now ready for new planting. In the coming weeks we will plant it with Buddleia, Lavender as well as other flowering shrubs, bulbs and plants. This will hopefully give us an array of colour throughout the year and encourage a wider diversity of wildlife into the area.



Cheswick Place

Although we previously agreed with Bloor Homes for work to be undertaken on the paths around Cheswick Place, very little activity has since taken place. SMBC was due to adopt the land in April, however this has not taken place yet. An inspector from SMBC was on site recently, but the Parish Council has not received any update.

The Precept

Every Parish Council in the Borough is responsible for setting its own precept charge. This charge is added to the Council Tax levied by Solihull MBC. The precept charge reflects the budget set by the Parish Council and is converted into an annual amount payable per property.

The amount payable by each household will vary according to which property band your house is placed in. Your tax band is shown on your Council Tax bill. There are 8 property bands which are determined by the Valuation Office Agency. For comparison purposes throughout the country a Band D property is always used.

This financial year(2022/23), the precept you pay has reduced from £40.15to £35.11 a reduction of £5.04. If you have looked at your Council Tax bill you will note that this is a reduction of 12.6%.

Expansion of the school

Although we have objected to the expansion for many reasons over the last year, this looks to now be progressing following the Planning Committee decision. Solihull Council need to put several Traffic Regulation Orders (TRO's) in place, before any building work can commence. These are in progress and details should be shared with us in the coming weeks. It is anticipated that the building or at least the foundation work will begin over the summer holidays.

We would like to remind everyone, that the entrance markings of the school are there to allow a safe crossing point for all to get to and from school safely. They are not personal parking spaces for dropping off!

Please consider all residents when parking and if you are able to walk and appreciate the greenery of the area we live in, please consider doing so, especially now the weather is better.

Blythe Valley

The building work on Blythe Valley continues, about 60% of the housing is now complete and occupied. We welcome our new neighbours into the Parish and hope that they will join the events we have planned over the coming months, so we can become more acquainted.

Several of you may have also noticed the recent Facebook posts about a BMX track being built on Blythe Valley, we can confirm this is correct and it is based next to the sports fields. It is not yet completed, it requires surfacing, but once this is done it will feature, jumps, tabletops and berms suitable for both novice riders and those of us who should know better!
